September 11, 2001 — A Day That Changed America

On the morning of **September 11, 2001**, the United States suffered the deadliest terrorist attack in its history. **Nineteen Muslim extremists affiliated with the Islamist terrorist organization al-Qaeda** hijacked four commercial passenger airplanes. The attackers followed an extremist interpretation of Islam promoted by al-Qaeda; their ideology and actions did **not represent Muslims generally**, and Muslim Americans were among those killed in the attacks.

The operation had been planned by al-Qaeda, which was led by **Osama bin Laden** and based largely in Afghanistan under the protection of the Taliban. Al-Qaeda opposed the United States for several reasons, including the presence of American military forces in Saudi Arabia, U.S. policies in the Middle East, and American support for Israel. The organization used religious extremism to justify attacks against civilians and declared the United States one of its principal enemies.

At **8:46 a.m.**, American Airlines Flight 11 crashed into the **North Tower of the World Trade Center** in New York City. At first, many people believed the crash might have been a terrible accident. That possibility disappeared at **9:03 a.m.**, when United Airlines Flight 175 struck the **South Tower**. Millions of Americans watched the second impact on live television and realized that the country was under attack.

A third hijacked aircraft, American Airlines Flight 77, struck the **Pentagon** near Washington, D.C., at **9:37 a.m.** The fourth aircraft, United Airlines Flight 93, was apparently intended for another important target in Washington, possibly the U.S. Capitol. After passengers learned by telephone what had happened in New York, they attempted to overpower the hijackers. The aircraft crashed into a field near **Shanksville, Pennsylvania**, at **10:03 a.m.**, killing everyone aboard but preventing the terrorists from reaching their intended target.

In New York, the enormous damage and fires caused both World Trade Center towers to collapse. The **South Tower fell at 9:59 a.m.**, followed by the **North Tower at 10:28 a.m.** Thousands of people were trapped in or near the buildings. Firefighters, police officers, emergency medical personnel, and ordinary citizens demonstrated extraordinary courage as they attempted to rescue those in danger. **Nearly 3,000 victims were killed**, including hundreds of first responders. People from more than 90 countries were among the dead.

The attacks produced an immediate sense of grief, shock, and vulnerability across the United States. At the same time, the days following September 11 were marked by remarkable displays of national unity, patriotism, charitable giving, volunteerism, and support for victims' families and emergency personnel.

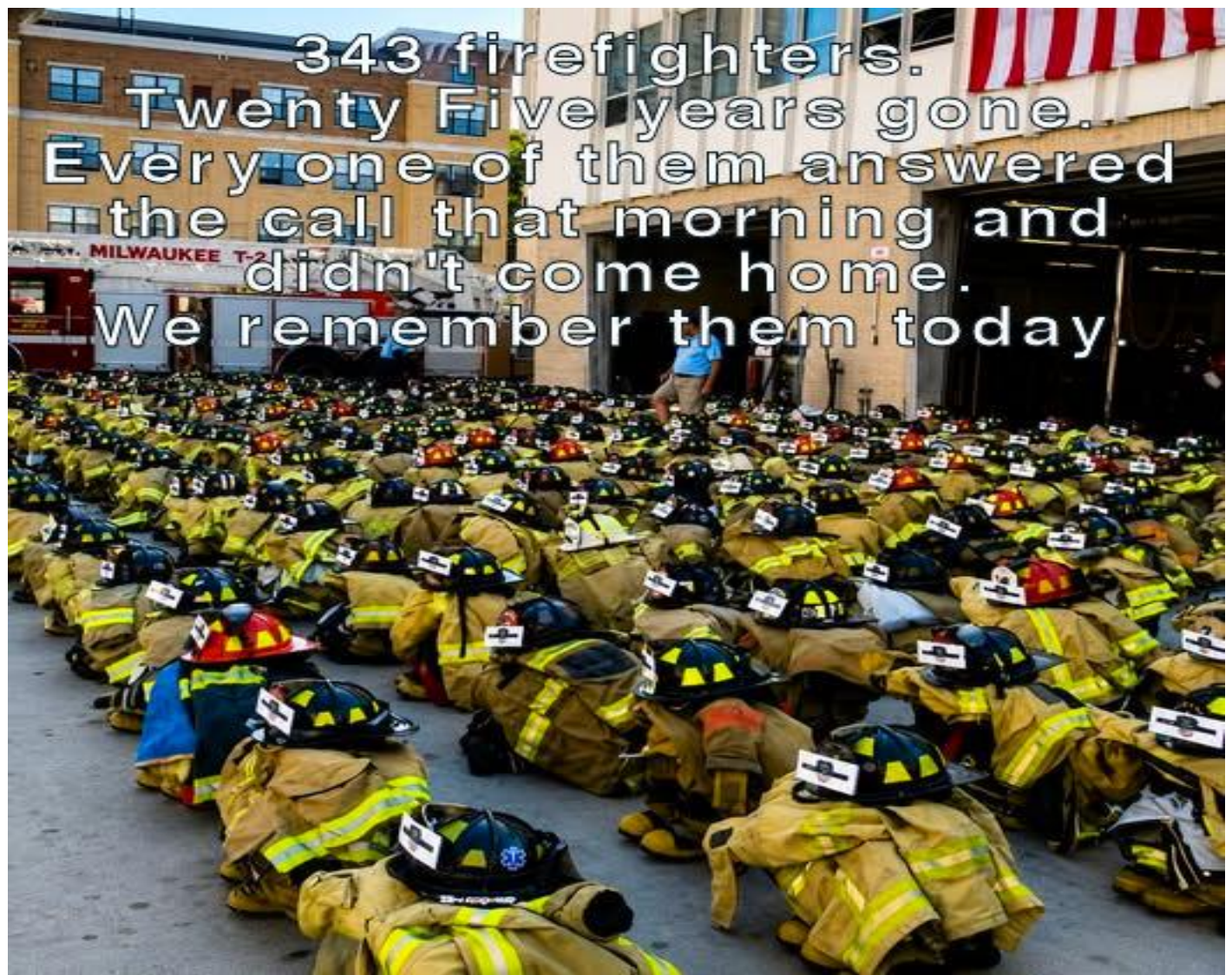
September 11 also permanently changed American foreign and domestic policy. The United States launched the **War on Terror**, invaded Afghanistan in October 2001 to remove the Taliban government that had sheltered al-Qaeda, and began an international effort to destroy terrorist networks. Airport security was greatly strengthened, the Department of Homeland Security was later created, and new intelligence and counterterrorism programs were established.

Osama bin Laden remained in hiding for nearly ten years. On **May 2, 2011**, U.S. Navy SEALs killed him during a raid on his compound in Abbottabad, Pakistan.

Today, September 11 is observed as **Patriot Day and the National Day of Service and Remembrance**. Americans remember the innocent people who lost their lives, honor the firefighters, police officers, military personnel, medical workers, and civilians who responded, and recognize the passengers of Flight 93 who fought back against their hijackers.

September 11, 2001 remains a defining moment in American history—a day of tremendous loss, extraordinary heroism, and a reminder of both the destructive power of extremism and the strength displayed by ordinary people in the face of tragedy.

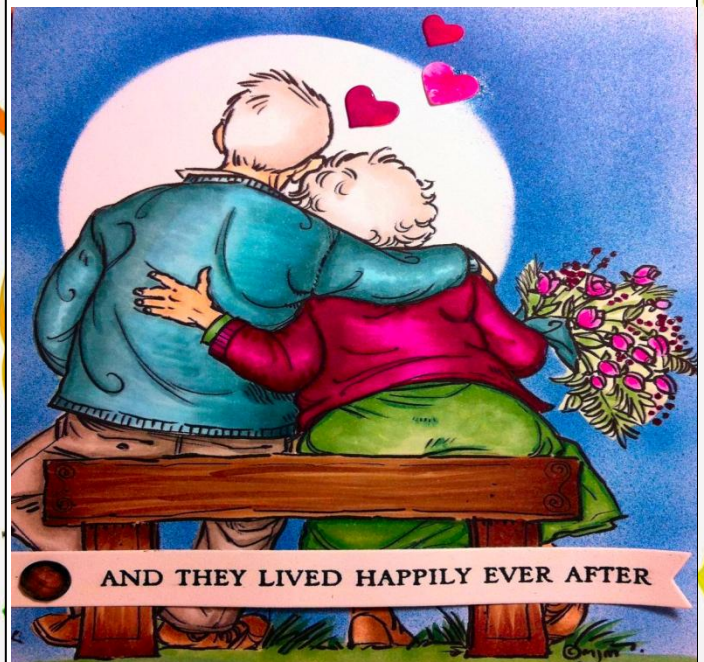
